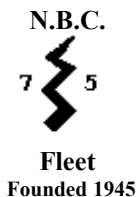

Lightning Fleet 75

2010 Scoring Rules



1. There will be 3 series, Spring (May and June), Summer (July and August) and Fall (September and October). Standings for the year shall be determined by adding the scores after throw-outs from each series.
2. At least three Lightnings must start for a race to be counted.
3. The low point scoring system in Appendix A of the RRS will be used, as changed below: (1 point for 1st place, 2 for 2nd place, 3 for 3rd, etc.)
4. Rule A2 is replaced with: Each boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores, excluding throw outs. There will be one throw out for each 4 races completed:

0-3 races	0 throw-outs
4-7 races	1 throw-out
8-11 races	2 throw-outs
12-15 races	3 throw-outs
16-19 races	4 throw-outs
20-23 races	5 throw-outs
24-27 races	6 throw-outs
5. Rule A4.2 and A9 are replaced with: For series scores, the number of fleet boats that check in with the committee boat that day will be used to determine penalty points. For scoring regattas, the number of registrants will be used.

OCS - Number of boats plus 1 point
DNS - Number of boats plus 1 point
DNF - Number of boats plus 1 point
RAF - Number of boats plus 1 point
DNC - Number of boats plus 2 point
DSQ - Number of boats plus 2 point
6. Visiting boats may participate in club races but their finishing positions are eliminated in the scoring of the series results.
7. Skippers that have raced (started) in at least half of the races in a series will receive their average score before throw outs for that series when they:
 - a. Volunteer for or are assigned to Race Committee or Safety Patrol, for at most three days per series.
 - b. Attend the Lightning District, Atlantic Coast, Woman's, Masters, NA or World Championship regattas when travel to these regattas makes it too difficult to attend a NBC regular series race.
 - c. Mentor a new skipper by crewing for them in a race, for at most one day per series.
8. Rule A8 is replaced with: A tie for a series or for the year shall be broken by counting throw-outs, one at a time, from the lowest score thrown out, until the tie is broken.
9. Article VIII 1 of the ILCA By-Laws is replaced with: There is no restriction on the number of people in a boat
10. Article VIII 2 of the ILCA By-Laws is replaced with: All skippers must be paid members of Fleet 75 and the ILCA to be scored, but crew are not required to pay dues.
 - a. Co-skippers must be members of Fleet 75 and the ILCA, but may join as crew.
 - b. Junior sailors (under 18) are encouraged to participate and will be scored as regular members, but do not need to pay fleet or ILCA dues.
 - c. Skippers and crew for the Lightning District Championship must be members of ILCA.
 - d. Dues must be paid by the start of the Magnus Pedersen Regatta. Skippers paying after the Magnus Pedersen Regatta will be scored from the date they pay their dues.
 - e. Skippers must be registered with a sail number. Points count towards the sail number.
